MVAR Division 37 Repeal and Replace Project

- Required due to scope of changes to implement ELD mandate
- Restructured Division 37 in force August 1, 2023
 - Meets current drafting standards
 - Improved clarity of wording and organization of the Division
 - Resolved existing numbering challenges created by previous amendments
 - Only substantive changes:
 - Implement a provincial ELD mandate
 - Provide authority for ELD exemptions to CVSE Director
- Consequential amendments required to:
 - Use of Electronic Devices while Driving Regulation in force February 13, 2023
 - Violation Ticket Administration and Fines Regulations (VTAFR) in force August 1, 2023
 - Motor Vehicle Fees Regulation in force August 1, 2023



Use of Electronic Devices while Driving Regulation

- Effective February 13, 2023
- Definitions added (s. 1)
 - Commercial motor vehicle
 - Electronic logging device
- ELDs added as a prescribed device (s. 3 (1)(a.1))
 - Ensures clarity that ELDs are subject to this regulation
- New prescribed activity Commercial motor vehicle with ELD (s. 5.1)
 - Ensures that drivers are allowed to respond to prompts from the ELD
 - Only applies to devices that:
 - Meet the definition of an ELD
 - Are mounted as required in MVAR Division 37
 - Allows new drivers to use an ELD
 - If the ELD is also an phone, use is specific to ELDs functionality



B.C.'s Provincial ELD Mandate

- Consistent for carriers regardless of operating locations
 - ELDs mandated for both extra-provincial and intra-provincial carriers
- Consistent with current use of "paper" daily logs
 - In general, if daily logs are currently required, ELDs required as of August 1
- Limited exemptions from ELDs
 - Granted under the authority of the CVSE Director for the purpose of "more effectively promoting and securing road safety"
 - May include conditions or substituted requirements
 - Issued by a Compliance Circular to allow one list of ELD exemptions
 - Exemptions from ELDs does not exempt from HOS
 - If exempt from using an ELD, driver will be required to use a "paper" record of duty status



Restructured MVAR Division 37

- Part 1 Interpretation
 - Updates existing definitions for consistency with federal regulations
 - Adds definitions to support provincial ELD mandate and improve clarity
- Part 2 Generally Applicable Safety Requirement
 - Responsibilities of carriers, shippers, consignees and drivers
 - Previously MVAR 37.12 embedded within the HOS part
- Part 3 Safety Certificate
 - Content mirrors Part 2 of current Division 37
 - Safety ratings updated to reflect safety ratings in use since 2015
 - Ability for CVSE Director to exempt carrier from displaying name on business vehicles



- Part 4 Hours of Service General
 - HOS provisions currently in Part 3 reorganized for improved clarity
 - Distributed across Parts 4 8 in amended Division
 - Part 4 covers general HOS requirements
 - Currently ss. 37.11 to 37.17.03
 - Reorganized to group related requirements
 - HOS requirements related to hours of work and rest remain the same
 - No changes to available HOS exemptions
 - Establishes "local driving hours" section (new s. 37.28)
 - Simplifies record-keeping requirements for carriers and drivers, while still allowing HOS enforcement
 - HOS exemption for non-passenger vehicles under 11,795 kg GVW remains in effect



Local Driving Hours

- Operating within a radius of 160 km from the home terminal
- Driver requirements:
 - Take at least 10 hours off-duty time in a day
 - Return to home terminal each day to take at least 10 consecutive hours offduty time before accumulating any additional on-duty time
 - Take at least 24 consecutive hours off-duty time in the previous 14 days
- Carrier requirements:
 - Maintain accurate and legible records for 6 months for each day the driver is on duty showing:
 - Cycle followed
 - Time driver reports for duty
 - Time driver is released from duty
 - Total number of hours the driver is on-duty

Local Driving Hours (continued)

- Will be exempt from ELDs while operating under local driving hours
- For occasional trips, exempt from ELD if:
 - No more than 1 trip outside 160 km for the current day or within the previous 14 days, to a maximum of 6 days withing a 60-day period
- Driver must maintain record of duty status for these trips

- Part 5 HOS ELD Records of Duty Status
 - New requirements to introduce provincial ELD mandate
 - Essentially mirrors federal ELD mandate
 - New offenses added for ELD requirements
 - Creates authority for CVSE Director to exempt carriers from ELD
 - Must be in the interest of more effectively ensuring road safety
 - May include conditions and/or substituted requirements
- Part 6 HOS Other Forms of Records of Duty Status
 - Covers existing requirements for paper daily logs
 - Currently ss. 37.16 to 37.18.03 and instructions from Schedule 2
 - Still allows for drivers/carriers to use apps for recording HOS if they are not required to use an ELD



- Part 7 HOS Possession, Distribution & Keepings of Records of Duty Status
 - Existing requirements updated to include ELD records
 - currently ss. 37.18.04 to 37.19
 - Ensures all carriers are required to verify records of duty status according to supporting records regardless of whether using ELD or another form of record of duty status
 - CVDHOSR only requires this for those using ELDs
 - Updated wording related to inaccurate records
 - Adds tampering with an ELD as a new offence
 - Separates out offences related to falsifying records
 - Will require appearance notice
 - Allows the option to pursue prosecution of third-parties hired by carriers to falsify records



- Part 8 HOS Inspections
 - Existing requirements updated to include ELD records
 - Currently ss. 37.19.01 to 37.21
- Part 9 Trip Inspection
 - Content mirrors Part 4 of current Division 37
 - Standard 13 not yet implemented, but revised numbering will facilitate future amendments
- Part 10 Compliance Reviews and Audits
 - Content mirrors Part 5 of current Division 37



- Part 11 Offences
 - Content mirrors Part 6 of current Division 37
 - Offences related to operating vehicles after a carrier's safety certificate has been suspended or after the cancelled
 - Will be able to be issued as violation tickets (\$520 fine)
 - Previously required an appearance notice
- Part 12 Bills of Lading
 - Conditions of Carriage moved to Schedules rather than in the text of the regulation
- Schedule 1 Sleeper Berth
- Schedule 2 Duty Status Grid
- Schedule 3 Specified Conditions of Carriage
- Schedule 4 Specified Conditions of Carriage Household George



VTAFR Amendments

- Updated section numbers for all offences
- Retaining existing three-tier fine structure
 - \$120 Generally administrative or procedurals offences with lower risk to safety
 - \$270 Offences that compromise safety, but are a lower risk than Tier 3
 - \$520 Offences that pose the most serious risk to public safety or indicate intent to avoid compliance
- Defining new fines for 35 new offences
 - To support enforcement of ELD mandate
 - Required due to restructuring of Division 37
 - 2 offences previously requiring appearance notices
- Increasing fines for 31 of the existing HOS violations
 - To better reflect safety implications of the violation



Summary

- Effective August 1, 2023, all commercial motor vehicles that operate provincially or federally will require ELDs unless
 - Specifically exempt from ELDs
 - Always exempt from HOS (GVW under 11,795 kg)
 - Operating under local driving hours (within 160 km of home terminal)

• This includes:

- Non-passenger commercial vehicles with licensed GVW over 11,794 kg
- Vehicles licensed under the Passenger Transportation Act
- Buses (seating capacity of 10 or more passengers plus the driver)
- Local drivers who go outside of 160 km more than:
 - 1 trip in the current day or within a 14-day period
 - More than 6 days in the previous 60 days
